If producing top riders for the future is one of Academy goals, well 2025 was a good example of how well it can work. Three Academy riders, Ollie Duguid, Charlie Toutel and Seth Davey, gained selection for the 2025 Island Games in Orkney with all three producing outstanding performances during the Games and helping the Guernsey team place second in the cycling medal table. Then we have young Zach Smith, who has raced and excelled at the top level on the U16 category in the UK, the European Youth MTB Championships in Sweden and other high level MTB races in Europe, it was a very busy season for him, culminating in him being invited to join BC's National School of racing....and that means he is very special. Well done to Zach and also to the three Island Games riders, this must inspire the younger riders, not just in the Academy also those in the U12 and U10 categories to aspire to achieve the same goals.

One the aims of the Academy is to 'Inspire the riders to aspire to achieve their goals', we will continue to work with this great bunch of your riders to help them achieve their goals, whatever they may be in the world of cycling.

The improved performances of our all of our Academy riders during the 2025 season is very evident in the race results, some very competitive racing, quicker times, PB's and records, with Seth Davey breaking some very good TT records along the way, Zach and Charlie fighting for top spot in the XC and CX races, this is all good news.
